Roy P writes: Rail turning

Another part of the track that has seen massive damage from excessive speed is the bottom curve after the bowling green straight, amazingly even to the point of it showing burring on the outside top corner of the rail. This section of rail has now been turned with the help of Tim, Mike P, Graham Miller, John G, John B, Tom C, Tom P, Norman, Cliff, Jim, Kevin and David Fry. Furthermore, this section of rail cannot be turned again because there is too much wear on the sides of the rail head. If turned derailment would be inevitable because the wheel flanges will strike the fishplate screw heads, this being one of the primary reasons for this session of essential rail turning.

Librarian Stephen Hutton writes:-

The Beech Hurst Library contains a collection of books and magazines related to our club and its activities. They are in six cupboards, which are in the main body of the clubhouse. Each book has a unique number and location, which is why it is important to return them to the correct position.

Cupboards 1 to 4, to the right of the workshop door, are normally locked. A librarian/assistant librarian can unlock them on demand. These contain the more valuable books and bound magazines.

Cupboards 5 - 6, to the left of the workshop door are normally open. The contents are available for members to peruse whilst at the club, providing they return the book to where they found it in the cupboards (See also 'Borrowing a book'). All books have a shelf and number so they can easily be located.

<u>Index</u>

There is a comprehensive index of the library contents by both author and title. The librarian will be happy to show you how to use it.

Borrowing a book

Any member can borrow almost any book. A librarian/assistant librarian will issue it to you. You will need to sign for the book. It's then yours for up to 3 months, after which you need to return it to the club. Providing no one else has requested it, you can then renew it. On return, books must be signed in by the librarian or an assistant librarian.

Magazines

The society currently subscribes to two magazines ('Engineering in Miniature' and 'Steam Railway') of which the latest two editions are left out in the club house for member's enjoyment. After this period, these magazines are stored in one of the locked cupboards. Loose club magazines must not leave the club. Please do not leave other copies of these magazines floating around the club house as it can cause confusion. Also, please note that it has been announced that 'Engineering in Miniature' will cease publication very soon.

Previous 'Engineering in Miniature's' and 'Model Engineers' are bound at which point they become available to borrow like any other books.
