



#### **Additions to the Materials Store**

Andrew recently obtained the following materials and sundries from Maidstone and EKP supplies, the latter being an absolute pleasure to deal with, having been recommended by Ron Harris, they have not only got a very good range of stock, but as I found, if you order on the morning of one day, the package turns up on the morning of the next, all the way from deepest, darkest Devon!

Anyhow, the list below can be added to the others published in the December and February news' to give our latest stock. There are one or two other bits that are still required, but they will either be ordered or obtained from the Harrogate exhibition in a couple of weeks' time. Please see either Andrew or Peter Marten at the club for your requirements in the meantime.

**NB** A word of warning however, I recently purchased the Olives and Nuts from Maidstone engineering. They were labelled as 3/16" (0.1875") pipe, but Ray took one to try on 'Martlet' and we then discovered that they are actually bored 5mm (0.196"), a difference of some 10 thou, that silver solder would barely take up, I suspect that all of the fittings may well be heading metric, which is fine in the case of 5/32"/4mm, but for most of the imperial sizes they are not that close to the metric equivalent and therefore not suitable for imperial pipe. Unless of course the pipe will soon be metric only as well, one can only wonder! The only way out would be to do as I do and 'D.I.Y.!' A bit time consuming though!
